Blazers Go to 4-H by: Michaela Bocci

ay 18, 2024 was a first for some of our Blazers. As well as some of our handlers. Four of our American Blazer Owners, from the Treasure Valley, were asked to showcase



their Blazer at Districts division of the 4-H Horse Judging competition. Everyone had so much fun showcasing their Blazers. Some of you maybe asking what did all of this entail? Every year each 4-H participant from each age division, ranging ages 8-18, must compete at one of the non-horse competitions. Not all get



the opportunity to move up from County, but those that do move on to Districts, then State and, if all that goes well, Nationals. For the Horse Judging competition, they step inside the shoes of show judges. They judge several different classes. For example, Halter,

Western Riding, Western Reining, English Equitation, just to list a few. In order to judge the halter classes, they need to know the different confirmations and breed characteristics. This is where our Blazers came in.

Each Halter class has 4 horses. Same breed, same gender. We took 4 of our Blazer Mares out to be judged. As they looked at confirmation, not only did they look at a side to side view, they





also needed to look at the front and back view of the horse. These participants look at confirmation from a



standstill position, but they have to look at the movement of each horse at the walk and trot. While looking at this, they look for any lameness in the horse. Can they even spot it? Did the horse drop its back in the trot? Were they consistent?

How do these competitors know if they got the right answer? Well, there is a professional judge there. He judges all the classes. The closer they get to the judge's selections the more points they get. That's not all that they are judged on. They are also judged for their presentation of their reasonings. They don't have to give the right answers in their reasons if they can convince you otherwise. Only one halter class and one riding class is selected for them to give their oral reasons. Michaela Bocci was lucky enough to be asked to judge this portion of the competition. "It was very tough to be a judge for the intermediates." She stated, "I remember being in their shoes and scared out of my mind. But I learned so much. And being able to impart my knowledge to them makes me feel like I'm teaching these kids something."

Thank you to Janet Miller for reaching out and asking us to participate. And good job to all the competitors this year. And if you're wondering how they placed...





What Is A Blazer Horse?

- To be considered a Blazer Horse, the horse must have at least one registered parent with a documented line to the foundation stallion, "Little Blaze."
- Blazer Horses must be between 13 hands and 15 hands at full maturity to be registered.
- Blazer Horses must have a solid coat color with dark underlying skin. These colors include brown, black, bay, and sorrel, as well as buckskin, palomino, and many shades of dun.
- White markings are limited to the face and below the knee or hock. Spotted coat patterns (appaloosa, pinto, paints) are not accepted into the registry.
- To be advanced into the Stud Book, both mares and stallions must be inspected by a veterinarian or certified inspector.
